

Responsible Minerals Sourcing Policy

Pyroban Ltd is committed to the responsible sourcing of materials used in its products, in accordance with health and safety, human rights, and environmental standards. Pyroban expects suppliers to adhere to these principles and operate responsibly throughout their supply chains.

Mining activities in certain regions have been associated with human rights abuses, environmental harm, and the financing of armed conflicts. These areas are referred to as Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas (CAHRAs), including countries identified under Section 1502 of the U.S. Dodd-Frank Act and Regulation (EU) 2017/821 concerning responsible mineral sourcing.

Tin, tungsten, tantalum, and gold (3TG) are classified as conflict minerals. Although Pyroban does not directly source minerals from mines and has no direct relationship with smelters or refiners, it recognises its responsibility as a downstream manufacturer to address associated risks within its supply chain.

Where appropriate, suppliers are requested to disclose their conflict mineral information using the latest Conflict Minerals Reporting Template or provide formal statements to support responsible sourcing within the supply chain.

Due to the complexity of multi-tiered supply chains, traceability of minerals to original smelters may be limited, and CMRT declarations provided to customers may therefore include unidentified smelters until further information is obtained from suppliers.

Pyroban conducts due diligence by collecting and assessing supplier information, as appropriate, and engaging with suppliers to promote responsible sourcing practices across its supply chain, with a focus on continuous improvement.

This policy is reviewed periodically to ensure continued alignment with applicable legal requirements and recognised international best practice.
